

## Spanish Level 3 – Advanced Spanish

Course Objectives	In this course students will have a systematic review and consolidation of what was learned in Levels 1 and 2. They will also have the opportunity to practice more spoken and written Spanish and learn more about the Hispanic world through a variety of techniques that develop communicative competence: everyday situations, conversations, creative face-to-face dialogues, oral presentations, written exercises and compositions, etc.
Course Content	Course Key Topic Area Includes:  This course will begin with a review of Level 2 structures and will continue with more on the Past Tense of irregular verbs, Direct and Indirect Object Pronouns and the Imperfect tense. It has been designed to expand vocabulary and grammar, and improve both pronunciation and conversational skills. Therefore, students will learn to speak about oneself and others in reference to the past by talking about a sequence of events that occurred in the past and asking questions about those events.



Course Co	ontent	They will also express actions that they used to do and what they liked, as well as to ask and explain how long ago a particular event took place. Students will be encouraged to speak about daily routines in the present and in the past tenses. They will also be exposed to the future tense to speak about their future plans.
