<b>Course Duration</b>	<b>Total Number of hours : 36</b> <b>Time : 3 hours / week</b>
<b>Course Objectives</b>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1. Explain basic Japanese grammar.</li><li>2. Practice basic four skills in Japanese (listening, speaking, reading, and writing).</li><li>3. Foster spoken communication skill in the limited situations such as at the hotel, school and shopping.</li><li>4. Introduce general knowledge of the Japanese people and their culture, including non-verbal communication.</li></ol>
<b>Course Content</b>	<b>Course Key Topic Area Includes:</b>  This course is an introduction to Japanese language and culture, designed for those who have completed absolute beginners level (=Japanese 1) or have equivalent knowledge of the Japanese language. Instruction will be given on the four skills of language (reading, speaking, listening, and writing), although emphasis will be placed on speaking and listening in order to help learners to acquire communicative skill for simple interaction with Japanese speakers.
<b>Learning Outcomes</b>	<b>At the end of the program the trainees will be able to:</b>  Gain practical spoken communication skills for limited daily situations. <ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1. Express your desire (<i>want to X</i>), like/dislike, impression of objects, events etc (<i>adjectives</i>).</li><li>2. Make a request. (<i>Please do X</i>)</li><li>3. Make a comparison.</li><li>4. Order foods at a restaurant (e.g. <i>Two “miso ramen” please</i>).</li><li>5. Describe and understand of the location of an object or place.</li><li>6. Express action in progress (<i>-ing</i>) and state of being (e.g. <i>The bank is open</i>).</li><li>7. Ask for permission and understand prohibition.</li><li>8. Express potential (<i>I can do X</i>)</li><li>9. Talk about past experience (e.g. <i>I have been to a Maid Cafe before</i>).</li></ol>
