- In 1973, Qatar's first national College of Education was founded.
- Today, Qatar University comprises seven colleges: Arts and Sciences; Business and Economics; Education; Engineering; Law; Pharmacy; and Sharia and Islamic Studies. Total of 60 undergraduate and graduate programs. It currently boasts a population of over 1000 faculty, 15,000 students and an alumni body of over 30,000.

Excellence in teaching

- The curriculum was based on a Canadian model with emphasis on clinical pharmacy and practice and being patient-oriented
- Curriculum Review (CC, PLOA, APR, CCAPP)
- Systematic Assessments and Improvements
- Customization to local need (Arabic counseling, direct students to Qatar market needs)



Excellence in research

- Last year, more than 50 papers, 60 posters and 70 oral presentation
- \$ 6 million in research grants
- 45 ongoing research grant (QNRF-NPRP, -UREP, -JSRA, -PDRA, QU)
- All undergraduate students participate in a minimum of two researchfunded projects (QNRF-UREP and QU Student Grants)
