

NHRC: Saudi trying to mislead public through false pretexts to justify violations

The National Human Rights Committee (NHRC) yesterday described the statement issued by the Saud authorities on Saturday as an attempt to mislead the public and provide false pretexts to justify abuses, sanctions and arbitrary unilateral measures, pointing out that the Saudi statement tried to claim that the Kingdom addressed the violations resulting from the

In statement, NHRC said: "At a time when the National Human Rights Committee and international organiza-tions were hoping that the Saudi authorities would resolve the humanitarian crisis, lift violations and compensate victims of the blockade, the Saudi authorities said in a statement carried by its (Saudi Press Agency SPA) on Sep statement carrier to ya is Saturi Press Agency SPA on Sep-tember 7, 2019, in which they attempted to mislead the public and provide false pretexts to justify violations, sanc-tions and arbitrary unilateral measures and also went on to claim that they addressed those violations resulting from the blockade."

The NHRC noted that the Saudi authorities are making The NHRC noted that the Saudi authorities are making once again a failed attempt to deceive the public and the international community by giving misleading statistics and figures to cover up their violations against citizens and residents of the State of Qatar, warning that attempts to conceal facts would not work for the Saudi authorities and would not prevent them from being condemned and the demand for compensation for the victims and to stop vio-lating their rights.

Decline in traffic accidents last year

Despite a decline in traffic accidents in 2018 compared to 2017 by seven percent, over 50 percent of traffic deaths were among young aged between 20 to 39 years old.

Also the total number of traffic fatalities last year was 168, among them 158 death cases were of males which represent 94 percent of total deaths and 10 were of

females representing six percent according to statistics released by the General Directorate of Traffic Regarding the ages of people

died in the traffic accidents, the sta-tistics point out that half of those who died in traffic accidents were died in traffic accidents were between 20 and 39 years old, which represent 52.4 percent of the total number of road traffic deaths in 2018. The number of road traffic deaths for people aged above 50 years reached 16 death cases which

represent 9.5 percent.

The General Directorate of Traffic said that most of the accidents last year were minor without injuries which is around 97.2 percent of total accidents. The number of accidents that led to deaths decreased by 3.1 percent in

2018 compared to 2017. The number of fatalities recorded in 2017 was 159 which recorded in 2017 was 159 which decreased by 5 percent in 2018 to reach 154. The Department pointed out that the reason for the decrease in the number of accidents deaths in 2018 is due to decrease in the number of pedestrian run-over

The Department also plans to reduce traffic accidents more this year compared to 2018 and will double its efforts specially related to run-over accidents and pedestrians accidents. Among the Department's initiatives to

decrease pedestrian accident deaths include installing lights in dark places and speed humps and distributing reflective bracelets to pedestrians especially in the Industrial Area. Inspite of all these efforts, the

Department said there are many challenges before them like traffic awareness campaigns in different languages for expatriates of dif-ferent nationalities, in addition to high number of new vehicles and the increase in the number of of comprehensive renaissance projects.

Organised by the Social and Economic Survey Research


Institute (SESRI), the two-day conference witnessed the partic-ipation of several international experts, scientists, researchers and decision makers from 20 countries around the world, in addition to the participation of the Counter-Terrorism Executive Directorate in the Security

The statement issued by the conference said that the partici-pants from research institutes, and research centers agreed to take steps towards the devel-opment and implementation of a global index of extremism that uses data collected from repre-

uses data collected from repre-sentative surveys to measure violent extremism in all countries and at different times. The statement included several recommendations, the most important of which is the need for member states to exchange research findings on

regional and national trends on regularly

Participants condemned all Participants condemned all forms and manifestations of extremism, regardless of its motives, stressing that violent extremism is one of the most serious challenges facing the world today and poses a great danger to the lives of many and young people in particular.

They pointed out that violent extremism and terrorism are global challenges that are not limited to specific countries, ideologies or religions, stressing the importance of evidence-based policy and interventions in combating violent extremism.

The recommendations also emphasised the need for collaboration between researchers, academics and policy makers in disseminating knowledge and best practices related to violent extremism, concerning its drivers, risk factors, methods of monitoring and measurement within communities

as well as the means to address it.


The recommendations noted the importance of the relevant Security Council resolutions, in particular the two resolutions, which required closer cooperation between the research community and the United Nations Counter-Terrorism Committee and its executive management.


