## Lorna Marie Bonnici West PhD MSc (Clin Pharm) BPharm (Hons.) Biography:

**Dr Lorna Bonnici** West graduated in Pharmacy from the University of Malta in 2000. She read for a Master of Science degree in Clinical Pharmacy at the Robert Gordon University, Scotland, and graduated in 2006. Dr Bonnici West worked as a clinical pharmacist at Mater Dei Hospital, Malta's main acute general hospital, within the respiratory field till June 2013, after which she was appointed

Principal Pharmacist of the oncology hospital section.

Dr Bonnici West was awarded a scholarship by the Malta Government Scholarship Scheme to read for a PhD at the Robert Gordon University, Scotland, and graduated in 2015. Her research applied mixed methods to investigate into aspects of medication wastage in Malta. In 2016 she was awarded a post-doctoral grant under the Reach-High Scholars Programme Scheme. The research programme was being conducted at the Department of Clinical Pharmacology and Therapeutics, University of Malta. The aim of the research programme was to determine behaviour and practices in relation to medication wastage. The aim was also to identify medication wastage minimisation strategies and the effects of quality improvement measures in relation to enhanced value and wastage minimisation in pharmacy processes. The research work was part-funded by the REACH HIGH Scholars Programme – Post Doctoral Grants. The grant was part-financed by the European Union, Operational Programme II – Cohesion Policy 2014 – 2020 'Investing in human capital to create more opportunities and promote the well-being of society' – European Social Fund.

Dr Bonnici West now works as a Senior Research Officer at the Malta College of Arts, Science and Technology's (MCAST) Research and Innovation Centre and holds a post of Visiting Senior Lecturer with the Department of Clinical Pharmacology and Therapeutics, University of Malta. Dr Bonnici West served on a number of committees and was the founder of the Malta Association of Hospital Pharmacists (MAHP) in 2013. She has collaborated with individuals and groups from various countries across the globe and has published in a number of high-profile peer-reviewed scientific journals and presented her work over 25 times at international conferences.
