

Two intersections to open partially

wo intersections at Duhail and Umm Salal Mohamed will be opened partially tomorrow along with the new three-lane Huwaila flyover, the Ministry of Interior (MoI) has announced.

While the Duhail intersection will facilitate entry to and exit from Shamal Road, connecting roads between Izghawa and Lusail, the Umm Salal Mohamed intersection links Umm Salal Mohamed, Jeryan Jenaihat and Shamal Road.

Giving further details, the ministry said in a post on Facebook that the Duhail intersection includes the road that connects the west (Izghawa) to the road heading south on Shamal Road, road connecting Izghawa to the east (Lusail), road coming from the east (Lusail) towards Izghawa, the flyover connecting the east (Lusail) to the south on Shamal Road and the road from Shamal

Fifth season of farm produce markets begins

The fifth season of the local farm produce markets yesterday began at the Al Mazrouah, Al Khor-Al Zakhira and Al Wakrah yards, the Ministry of Municipality and Environment said in a statement.

The yards for selling local vegetables, fish and poultry will be open to customers thrice a week - Thursday, Friday and Saturday - from 7am until 5pm. The yard for selling livestock at Al Mazrouah will remain open throughout the week, from 7am until 5pm. Some 80 farms are participating in the initiative.

Abdul Rahman al-Sulaiti, general supervisor, said the yards witnessed a good turnout of visitors on the first day and a wide variety of fresh vegetables was on offer. He stressed that the yards offered fruits and vegetables at "competitive rates" - lower than

QU SESRI holds workshop on 'Advanced Sampling'

The Social & Economic Survey Research Institute (SESRI) at Qatar University (QU) held a four-day workshop on "Advanced Sampling" recently to introduce researchers to the principles and practice of analysing data from complex sample surveys.

The event brought together more than 40 participants from across QU to exchange their ideas and knowledge, and share their experiences on complex sample survey data. SESRI director Dr Hassan al-Sayed delivered the opening remarks.

The workshop was led by Prof James M Lepkowski (research professor emeritus at the University of Michigan and research professor at the Joint Programme in Survey Methodology at the University of Maryland) and Prof Patricia Berglund (senior research associate in the Survey Methodology Programme at the Institute for Social Research).

They presented the principles of survey design and how design features affect analysis methods as well as the use of statistical software to do such analysis. They also illustrated methods for analysing survey data with such features through examples using an education survey from Qatar, and implemented such analyses using two statistical software systems - SPSS

In his remarks, Dr al-Sayed noted that complex sample surveys are those employing one or more basic sampling design or estimation techniques such as weights, stratification, cluster sampling, nonlinear estimation, variance estimation, or imputation.

He further noted that these features were examined to help participants understand why they make analysis of such data more complex.

"By hosting this event, SESRI is working towards QU's strategic objective to seek efficient solutions to issues that impact the wider community and to ensure that research efforts address contemporary challenges in Qatar and beyond," Dr al-Sayed said.

"SESRI continues to deliver on its mission to enhance research capacity by studying and monitoring important societal changes, and to provide sound and reliable data to guide policy formulation, priority-setting and evidence-based planning and research in the social and economic sectors," he
